**NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS.** *Thorax* is the journal of The Thoracic Society. It is primarily intended for the publication of original work on diseases of the thorax and relevant anatomical and physiological studies. Original contributions may be submitted to the Editors by workers who are not members of the Society.

All papers submitted for publication should be referred to one of the Editors: R. Abbey Smith, Ch.M., F.R.C.S. (anatomy and surgery), Walsgrave Hospital, Coventry CV2 2DX, and Colin Ogilvie, M.D., F.R.C.P. (pathology, physiology, and medicine), Regional Cardio-thoracic Centre, Broadgreen Hospital, Thomas Drive, Liverpool L14 3LB.

Papers are accepted on the understanding that they are subject to editorial revision and that they are contributed to this journal only. Adequate reference should be made to previous work on the subject of the paper. A paper describing a single case will not generally be accepted unless the case is rare or shows important features which have not been previously described, or has been made the subject of special observation or experiment.

Papers reporting experimental procedures on patients, not essential for the investigation or treatment of their own case, must be accompanied by a written assurance that these were carried out with the informed consent of the patients concerned.

Papers sent for publication must be typewritten on one side of the paper only with double spacing. Where half-tone reproduction of radiographs is required authors should satisfy themselves that the appearances which they desire to demonstrate are shown clearly on the prints. Photographs and photomicrographs should be printed on glossy paper and should be submitted unmounted, and lettering, when required, should be indicated on tracing paper fixed over the print. Drawings and diagrams should be done in black ink on tracing linen. Bristol board, or stout, white paper. Coloured illustrations may be accepted provided the author pays the additional expenses. Legends should be typed on a separate sheet of paper.

Papers should be prefaced by an abstract of the argument and findings. The abstract must be less than 250 words long and should be more comprehensive than a summary which will not be required. Authors should not submit large tables of unanalysed data. Instead, the mean and variation should be given, if this is appropriate, and a footnote to the paper should state from whom full details of the data may be obtained.

**REFERENCES.** In the text the year of publication in brackets must follow the author's name: Brown (1970). All authors' names should be cited the first time they are quoted and, if there are more than two authors, as Brown *et al.* (1970) thereafter. At the end of the paper, references should be arranged in alphabetical order of authors' names. Such references should give the author's name, followed by initials and year of publication in brackets, the title of the article, the full name of the journal in which the article appeared, the volume number in arabic numerals, followed by the number of the first page of the article.

Contributors will receive one page proof, but it is assumed that all corrections will have been made in the original manuscript; major alterations in the proof cannot be accepted.

**REPRINTS.** Fifty reprints of articles will, if desired, be provided free. A limited number of additional reprints at cost price can be supplied if application is made when returning proofs. An estimate of costs will be given on application to the Publishing Manager, British Medical Association.

Papers which have been published become the property of *Thorax* and permission to republish must be obtained from the Editors.
